HUNGARIAN SAYS U.S. HAS MISUSED U.N.

Hanoi, Aug. 1--The U.S. imperialists' plot to misuse the United Nations to set up a so-called "Hungarian Committee of the United Nations" was exposed by Denes Felkai, Charge d'Affaires ad interim of the Hungarian Embassy in Hanoi, at a press conference here yesterday.

Analyzing the "conclusions" of the 2,000-page report of the "Hungarian Committee," Denes Felkai said: "We think that the committee members either have not acquainted themselves with certain facts generally known, or-- following some sort of sickness--have a short memory." He then gave some well-known facts showing the United States has planned to carry out the Hungarian counterrevolution through two stages:

1--The so-called "National Communists" disguised as communists to overthrow the working class power.

2--To hold general elections under the control of the United Nations, then restore the capitalist regime in Hungary and drag this country into NATO.

The Charge d'Affaires pointed out that members of imperialist legations in Budapest--namely, of France, Britain, the United States, and others--had actively taken part in the preparations and direction of the events.

He further cited a paragraph of the resolution of the recent national congress of the Hungarian Socialist Workers' Party adopted on behalf of some 350,000 party members: "The revolutionary government of workers and peasants, by calling on the assistance of the Soviet Army in furtherance of the Warsaw Treaty, has acted for the most sacred cause of the Hungarian people, namely, for the defense of their freedom as well as general interests of peace and socialism.

"And the Soviet Union, in granting Hungary this aid, has acted as a true friend of the Hungarian people. She has fulfilled her tasks which proceed from the principle of proletarian internationalism."

Denes Felkai continued: Among the 111 witnesses mentioned in the report, 81 have been interrogated behind closed doors without mentioning their names, and among them were many persons 16 years old. He stressed that a great number of these witnesses were leaders of the counterrevolution.

He concluded: A Hungarian saying is worth the report of the U.N. committee which was so noisily announced: "The mountains were in labor, and a ridiculous rat was born."

The conference was followed by the projection of two Hungarian newsreels respectively on the October counterrevolutionary conspiracy last year and socialist construction in Hungary.

#### DRV YOUTH LEADER URGES UNITY OF KOREA

He added that with the constant support and approval of peace-loving people throughout the world, and the support and immense assistance of socialist and people's democratic countries headed by the Soviet Union and China, the struggle for peace and unity of the two countries will surely be victorious.

The meeting was sponsored by the youth delegation of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, and was attended by youth delegates of the Democratic Republic of Vietnam, Czechoslovakia, Bulgaria, Mongolia, Albania, and Poland.
