

HUNGARIAN--DEMONSTRATIONS

LONDON, OCT. 24-(REUTERS)-THE HUNGARIAN CONSULATE IN LONDON WAS STONED TODAY AND EIGHT YOUTHS WERE ARRESTED IN OSLO AS REFUGEES CONTINUED PROTEST DEMONSTRATIONS MARKING THE FIRST ANNIVERSARY OF LAST YEAR'S UNSUCCESSFUL REVOLT IN HUNGARY.

FIVE WINDOWS IN THE LONDON CONSULATE WERE SMASHED WHEN A CROWD, BELIEVED TO BE MADE UP OF HUNGARIAN EXILES, GATHERED AROUND THE BUILDING. THE CROWD DISPERSED BEFORE POLICE ARRIVED AND NO ARRESTS WERE MADE.

IN OSLO, NORWEGIAN POLICE TOOK EIGHT YOUNG HUNGARIAN REFUGEES INTO CUSTODY FOR TRYING TO BREAK THROUGH A CORDON AROUND THE HUNGARIAN LEGATION, THE NEWSPAPER ARBEIDERBLADET REPORTED.

THE MARCH ON THE LEGATION WAS ORGANIZED AFTER A MEETING AT THE UNIVERSITY OF OSLO COMMEMORATING THE REVOLUTION. POLICE SAID THE EIGHT YOUTHS ARRESTED WERE LATER RELEASED.

IN BONN, WEST GERMANY, 16 STUDENTS STOOD WATCH EARLY TODAY OVER A BONFIRE SYMBOLIZING THE "CONTINUATION OF THE REVOLUTION." THE STUDENTS HELD BURNING TORCHES AND A HUNGARIAN FLAG WHILE A BLONDE HUNGARIAN GIRL STOOD MOTIONLESS BESIDE THE FIRE.

"WE ARE NOT BURYING THE REVOLUTION," SAID ONE STUDENT, "BUT COMMEMORATING THE FACT THAT IT CONTINUES."

HUNGARIAN REFUGEES IN ROME PLACED A WREATH BEARING HUNGARY'S NATIONAL COLORS ON THE TOMB OF ITALY'S UNKNOWN SOLDIER YESTERDAY.

MEANWHILE, THE VATICAN RADIO SAID "NO ACT OF VIOLENCE, NO RESTRICTION WILL SUCCEED IN BREAKING DOWN THE INTERNAL FRONTIERS OF MAN'S SPIRIT."

COMMENTING ON THE "SEVERE MEASURES" TAKEN BY THE HUNGARIAN GOVERNMENT TO PREVENT ANY SERVICES MARKING LAST YEAR'S REVOLUTION, THE RADIO SAID: "ALTHOUGH THEIR BODIES MAY BE IMPRISONED, THE HUNGARIAN PEOPLE WILL REMEMBER ALL THE MORE VIVIDLY THEIR DEAD AND THEIR IDEALS IN THE DEPTHS OF THEIR HEARTS."

BRITAIN'S CONSERVATIVE YORKSHIRE POST TODAY URGED WESTERN GOVERNMENTS TO SEARCH FOR A POLICY WHICH MIGHT GIVE HOPE TO THE HUNGARIAN PEOPLE.

"AS LONG AS THERE ARE RUSSIAN TROOPS IN HUNGARY, OR ANY SATELLITE COUNTRY, THE CRIES OF 'HELP' WHICH WERE BROADCAST FROM BUDAPEST LAST YEAR, MUST NOT BE FORGOTTEN," THE NEWSPAPER SAID. SIMILAR EDITORIALS APPEARED IN SEVERAL NEWSPAPERS THROUGHOUT EUROPE.

THE HUNGARIAN LEAGUE FOR THE UNITED NATIONS MEANWHILE CRITICIZED THE HOLDING OF A DEBATE ON HUNGARY DURING THE U.N. ASSEMBLY.

IN A UNITED NATIONS DAY MESSAGE, THE LEAGUE SAID IT "NOTES WITH DISPLEASURE THAT THE 12TH PLENARY SESSION OF THE UNITED NATIONS IS LISTENING TO INSULTS AND SLANDERS AGAINST THE HUNGARIAN GOVERNMENT, DESPITE THE PROTESTS OF MILLIONS OF THE HUNGARIAN PEOPLE."
