He says regarding his experiences gained during a visit to Budapest that he met people whose feelings, ambitions, and wishes are the same as those of the Americans. Above all, the people in Budapest want peace, he says, because they are well aware of the fact that without it no one can achieve anything.

We found friends and the smile of hospitality everywhere, especially in Budapest. For the last 15 to 20 years, the people here have experienced much hardship and privation, but they are making good the damage and are looking to the future with a courage which evokes the admiration of the entire world.

We have found that the people here do not know enough about the United States. We, too, find it hard to understand everything that is going on here. In my opinion, thinking people are aware that ultimately we will all have to live in accord with the laws of decency and good will and judge action of ourselves and others by these norms.

Our stay in Budapest has been a memorable one for us. Having met and talked with you, we cannot help but feel affection for you. We must find means to help each other advance and live always in peace side by side.
